NATURE & LANDSCAPES

Generous and miserly, cruel and graceful, fascinating nature of Montenegro has always aroused excitement and inspiration.

"The most beautiful meeting of land and sea at the time of the birth of our planet" (J. G. Byron) has created many small bays and a large Bay of Kotor, hidden wild beaches and a thirteen kilometers long Velika plaža with healing powers.

White and gray waste land of limestone area rises above the coastline. "Sea of rocks" is only one segment of the sumptuous mosaic. In the central region there are the fertile Zetska and Bjelopavlička plains and a bird paradise - Skadar Lake. Then there is a wreath of mountain ranges over 2,000 meters high. Apart from the peaks, they are adorned by woods, spacious pastures, forty lakes, impetuous and clean rivers, deep and mysterious canyons. The worlds of beauty are under water and underground - in many caves whose exploration has only begun. Montenegro has five national parks. Durmitor with the Tara River Canyon is part of the world natural heritage. The Tara River Canyon is on the list of international biosphere reserves. As a rare wetland habitat Skadar Lake is included on the Ramsar List.

In 1991 Montenegro was proclaimed ecological state.

Five areas in Montenegro have the status of national parks: Lovćen, Durmitor, Biogradska gora, Lake Skadar and Prokletije.

Their natural and cultural values are presented in visitors centers, and opportunities for active recreation are numerous. Besides the marked walking, hiking and biking trails, in the parks you can find thematic, educational and wine paths. There is also sports fishing, cruising, camping, adventure park, rent-a-bungalow...



Lakes & Rivers

Mountain lakes are mostly glacier lakes, doomed to slow disappearance.

The largest are Crno jezero (Black Lake), Plavsko and Biogradsko, and as for their beauty the following single out Hridsko, Zabojsko, Zminje, Škrčko, Trnovačko, Pešića Lake... Whether they are embraced by coniferous trees or grass, their water is clean and pleasant for swimming in summer, and is always interesting to anglers. There are many legends about emergence of these lakes.

Skadar Lake collects water from the mountains intended for the Adriatic Sea. They are brought to the lake by the rivers Zeta, Cijevna and Morača and conveyed by Bojana to the sea. All other rivers rush to the Black Sea: Tara, Piva, Lim with a wide network of tributaries and streams. Waters are a great wealth of Montenegro: clean, fresh, mostly wild and impetuous, stronger than rock. They etch deep canyons, roll snow and trees, hide big fish, refresh and inspire...









Mountains

They add to a small state a lot of space, height and width, depth and shape.

Each mountain is a story for itself. Bjelasica is tame, Durmitor is unpredictable, Prokletije is the most beautiful mosaic, Sinjajevina is mystical, Orjen is porous, Komovi is proud, Moračke is demanding...

There are springs, streams, rivers, glacier lakes, cliffs and peaks to which clouds are rushing, caves, vast forests, pastures, villages and high mountain summer cottages, herds that graze freely, areas that no one has ever passed through... And all this in four variants, because seasons on the mountain are clearly distinguished. It is also true that snow remains on some mountains in the warmest days of August and then at about 2000 meters above sea level you can swim in the lake – and throw snowballs.



Canyons

The fact that the deepest canyon in Europe is in Montenegro is not accidental at all. This whole area of high mountains is intersected by canyons whose grandeur is breathtaking. Roads pass through some of these and their verticals are well known (Morača, Cijevna, Piva and Ibar). You can discover others like the Tara River Canyon and canyon of the river Lim if you give yourself up to the wild waters, roaring rapids and waterfalls and emerald whirlpools while rafting or kayaking. A little more courage is needed for canyoning.

Synonym for canyoning in Montenegro is the canyon Nevidio, but even more difficult (the coldest and darkest) challenge is the canyon Grlje (Prokletije). Attractive are the canyons Škudre (Kotor) and Trebješice and Bogutovski potok (flows into the river Morača). However, these are only parts of the manuscript of water in the rocks and many have not been seen yet.







Sea and Beaches

The Adriatic Sea is one of the warmest seas and is one of the cleanest and clearest seas rich in marine flora and fauna.

Through the Strait of Otranto it is connected with the central part of the Mediterranean Sea. Its width is greatest between Montenegro and Southern Italy (about 200 kilometers). Contrast of enchanting waters of the Adriatic and gigantic Montenegrin mountains is softened by sandy beaches, sunsets and bays, Mediterranean and tropical plants, pine trees and olive groves and white towns along the coast. The contrast is apparent when you take the road from Kotor up the Lovćen serpentines. Each curve reveals a new, more magnificent, exciting and somewhat frightening view of the Bay of Kotor, "the beauty of beauties", created according to the legend, by the will of the god of the sea, – Poseidon himself.

Flora & Fauna



Interweaving of climate types, permanent rotation of southern and northern air currents make these areas suitable habitat for over three thousand plant species, including many endemic and relict species.


Especially significant is the wealth of medicinal and aromatic herbs, wild fruits and edible fungi. Dark conifer forest (spruce, pine, fir) are credited for the name of the country - Montenegro. This is the home of one of the two European virgin forests - Biogradska gora.

You can find over three hundred animal species, including some that are rare elsewhere. Apart from wolves, bears, chamois, doe, marten and lynx you can find otter, griffon vulture, golden eagle, peregrine falcon, hawk, tufted duck; Apollo butterfly, rocky mole, alpine shrew mouse, common Goldeneye... There are also significant species of amphibians, snakes, lizards, and most interesting is the triton - alpine newt.

OLD TOWNS & TEMPLES


It is hard to resist the charm of medieval towns and fortresses on Montenegrin coast: Budva, Kotor, Risan, Perast, Herceg Novi, Bar, Ulcinj... This is where Byzantine school and Romanesque, Gothic, Baroque waves in architecture, stone sculptures and paintings are touching and interweaving. The city of Kotor is, as part of the world cultural heritage, under UNESCO's protection.

A substantial part of the old religious architecture is also well preserved. The following monasteries single out for their monumentality and beauty: the monasteries of Morača, Piva, Sveta Trojica (Holy Trinity), Đurđevi stupovi, Savina and Ostrog - one of the world's greatest shrines. There are also the Saint Tryphon Cathedral and Gospa od Skrpijela (Church of Our Lady of the Rocks)... As for Islamic religious objects, Husein Pašina Džamija (Hussein-Pasha's Mosque) in Pljevlja stands out for its beauty.

Film Centre of Montenegro

The Film Centre of Montenegro is a newly established public institution with the aim of creating the proper, stimulating environment for the Montenegrin film community and its promotion to Europe and the world. Its main activities include: the management of the film fund; the support of new film productions; the promotion of Montenegrin cinema and its potential for international productions; training programmes for film professionals directed towards raising the level of their professional skills; as well as the series of activities around film festivals and film literacy.

Montenegro is a member of Eurimages and Creative Europe and its MEDIA sub-programme.

Main activities:

- the establishment of conditions for film production and co-production cooperation;
- creating conditions for the promotion, presentation and integration of contemporary film creativity into regional and international flows;
- creating favorable conditions for increasing the number and volume of foreign recording in Montenegro;
- initiating regulations and creating conditions for stimulating business environment and development of cinema;
- participation in the programs of the European Union and the Council of Europe in the field of cinema, as well as realization of the activities arising from membership in European and world associations;
- creating conditions for collecting dedicated funds for financing cinema through a film fund;
- the suppression of illegal traffic and the use of cinematographic works;
- improvement of measures and activities for the protection of children and youth, gender equality and respect for the diversity of members of minority peoples and other minority national communities;
- realization of activities for improvement of complementary activities;
- forming and running a database of statistical data for the field of cinema and
- performing other activities arising from a determined public interest in cinema, in accordance with this Law and the act on the establishment of the Center.







FINANCIAL OPTIONS

CO-PRODUCTION

Film projects with international partners can benefit from the selective minority co-production support, which is provided by Film Centre of Montenegro through annual calls for development and production of Montenegrin films.

Among several support schemes is a Minority Co-production Scheme that provides funding for projects originating outside Montenegro, but with Montenegrin participation.

Public call for minority co-productions is published annually, and the selection of the project is based on previously established criteria related to the quality and feasibility of the project, as well as the participation of the Montenegrin side.

Films supported through this scheme must be able to qualify as official co-productions, either under bilateral treaties, or the European Convention on Cinematographic Co-production.

CASH REBATE

25% of the qualifying local expenditure

Film Centre of Montenegro offers incentives for foreign producers that intend to film in Montenegro.

Producers has the possibility to get a cash rebate of the invested funds for the film/television project. The refund can cover up to 25% of eligible expenditures spent in Montenegro for the making of the film and is granted after meeting certain conditions. The right to a cash rebate may be granted to the producer of a cinematographic work, a co-producer or production company that performs a service, provided that:

1. the funds spent for the realisation of a cinematographic work in Montenegro are not provided from the budget of Montenegro or the FCM and are not less than EUR 100,000;
2. all taxes, contributions and other fiscal obligations prescribed by law have been previously settled in Montenegro;

3. a producer or co-producer has at least one feature film that was shown to the public.

The right to a cash rebate for a part of the funds spent in film production can be acquired by a producer for the production of live-action, animated and documentary films, television films and series, which are fully or partially produced in Montenegro and which are intended for public presentation.

For full foreign productions, regardless of the number of producers and the countries from which they come, the foreign producer who is the project owner is obligated to hire a film producer from Montenegro, who will start and participate in the proceedings regarding the return of funds as a production service.

Working permits

To obtain a work permit a foreign citizen needs to find a company willing to hire them or to set up their own company. Usually one year work permits are issued. Work permits can be refused if the quota set by the authorities for that year has been exceeded.

Work permit shall be a document on the basis of which the employer may conclude a labor contract or special contract with a foreigner, in accordance with the Law. The Employment Bureau of Montenegro shall issue a work permit for a foreigner. The Ministry in charge of labor affairs shall prescribe the contents of work permit, procedure for issuing and manner of entering the data.

The request for issuing a work permit shall be submitted by:

- 1) the foreigner who has the approval for habitual residence in Montenegro;
- 2) the employer for a foreigner who has the approval for temporary residence in Montenegro

The request shall be submitted to the Employment Bureau.

Shooting permits

A foreign producer can make a cinematographic work on the territory of Montenegro independently or in co-operation with a domestic or foreign co-producer, with a previously obtained approval issued by the Ministry of culture of Montenegro.

If the shooting of cinematographic work in a particular location requires special permits, foreign producer or domestic producer on his behalf, are required to obtain such permit by the authorities or organizations designated by special regulations, prior to shooting.

Temporary Import of Professional Equipment

For shooting on the territory of Montenegro, foreign producer may temporarily import equipment necessary for shooting, without the payment of customs duties and taxes, after obtaining the approval of Ministry of culture. Since regaining independence in 2006, Montenegro has embarked on an economic reform and privatization drive that has led to strong economic growth, which exceeded 7% last year. The country is also a candidate for membership in the European Union.

Since 2008, Montenegro has become the 66th country which joined the ATA Carnet System.

The ATA Carnet is a simple international customs document which permits the temporary import in the foreign country. Carnets are issued exclusively by chambers of commerce, members of the ATA international guarantee chain.

With reasonable costs and minimal formalities, the ATA Carnet is issued by the Chamber of Economy of Montenegro. NOTE: The sooner you submit the application for issuing the ATA carnets, the soon you will get one. It is recommended that the procedure for getting the carnets start not later than 3 days prior to travel.

Hotels & Amenities





Transport

You can get to Montenegro by all the means of transport at any time and in every season by land, sea or air: by plane, boat, yacht, train, bicycle and car.




Airports, Sea Transport, Buses and Railways

It takes only two hours to get to Montenegro from most of the European capitals. There are two international airports – in Podgorica (12 km from the city) and Tivat (4 km from the city center). Companies which regularly fly to the airports of Montenegro are the following: Montenegro Airlines, Air Serbia, Adria Airways, Aeroflot, Turkish Airlines, Austrian Airways, Alitalia, Ryanair, Wizzair, Smartwings, Easyjet and in summer months numerous charter companies operate. The ports of Bar, Budva, Kotor and Herceg-Novi have a status of ports for international traffic. For the most beautiful and largest yachts (to 150 meters long) there is Porto Montenegro in Tivat which is a marina with comprehensive services. If you chose to go by bus, you can check schedule, book or simply buy a ticket through service BusTicket4.me – www.busticket4.me

For those who travel by car, the roads are good and the sea and high mountains are connected by the Adriatic road and the new road Risan-Žabljak. The fastest way to reach the sea from Podgorica is through the tunnel Sozina.

Total length of the roads in Montenegro is 5,277 km. In Montenegro there is no highway, but there are roads with three lanes on some sections. On the other side Montenegro has a significant number of tunnels and bridges on its roads.

VISA REGIMES – Overview of visa regimes for foreign citizens

Registration of Your Stay in Montenegro:

All foreign citizens without registered permanent residence are obliged to register with police and report change of address 24 hours after they enter the country. If you are staying in a hotel or private accommodation owners of these facilities will do it for you.

UNOFFICIAL BORDER CROSSINGS

If you are planning to take a hiking tour which includes crossing of the state border outside the official state border crossing points (e.g. Prokletije, Hajla, Ljubisnja, Kamenica Gora, Maglic, Orjen mountains...), a relevant legal procedure must be observed.

The application form for crossing a state border outside the official state border crossing points should be lodged with the competent institution, namely state border police of the country

from which you are exiting. Border police of the exiting state shall undertake all the necessary measures so to provide for your safe crossing. When making plans to exit Montenegro outside the official state border crossings points, the Application form should be lodged with the local border police office which is in charge for the relevant area (contacts are attached) and they will provide you with their reply in a timely fashion. In cooperation with the border police of the neighboring country, a competent organizational unit of the border police shall provide all the conditions for your uninterrupted and safe crossing and inform you thereof.

The Application form may be lodged for groups and individual crossings the state border.

Along with the filled Application form, a scanned travel documents should be sent by email or by fax.

Customs Regulations

Residents and non-residents can physically bring in and out of Montenegro, without declaring it to the customs authority, currency in Euro and/or foreign equivalent other than the Euro, in total amount of up to 10,000 Euro.

Credit cards and other similar transferable instruments of payment must be declared to the customs authority at the time of entering or leaving Montenegro.

In Montenegro it is allowed to bring in products for infant feeding and dietetic food used for medical rea-

sons, provided that it does not require special methods of storage. These products must have a declaration and undamaged packaging.

Tourists are allowed to have in their luggage dried fruits, vegetables, mushrooms, raw coffee, spices and teas whose total weight must be less than one kilogram and one liter of alcoholic beverage in original packaging with declaration.

Bringing in two liters of another beverage is allowed and it must also have declaration and must be packed in the original packaging. Bringing in up to five liters of bottled water in its original packaging is also allowed.

Natural persons (buyers), who don't have permanent or temporary residence in Montenegro, are entitled to VAT refund for products purchased in Montenegro and taken out of Montenegro. Such right doesn't include mineral oils, alcohol and alcoholic beverages and tobacco products.

Podgorica, capital of Montenegro, has the highest temperatures during the year. Average temperatures are: January 2 to 10°C, August 21 to 32°C.

The sea temperature during the summer is 26°C and approximately 14°C in winter.

Crkvice – village in Krivošije, on the outskirts of the Mount Orjen in Montenegro. It is the wettest inhabited

place in Europe. Crkvice is within the Mediterranean subtropical belt. While summers are hot and sunny, autumn, winter and spring are rainy seasons.

A peculiarity of the littoral Dinarids is the precipitation regime as the cities in Orjen receive more precipitation than any others in Europe. Like the monsoon rain it is seasonally distributed, thus November thunderstorms sometimes

pour 2000 liters of water in several days, while August is frequently completely dry leading to forest fires. With a maximum discharge of 350 m³/s water one of the biggest karst springs, the Sopot spring, is a remarkable indicator of this seasonality. Most of the time it is inactive but after heavy rain a remarkable waterfall appears 20 m above the Bay of Kotor.



Žabljak – small town is in the centre of the Durmitor mountain region and with an altitude of 1,456 metres, it is the highest situated town on the Balkans. Žabljak is centre of Montenegro's mountain tourism. The entire area of Durmitor mountain is protected as a national park, and offers great possibilities for both winter and summer mountain tourism.

Žabljak caters for activities such as:


Skiing - Durmitor's snow cover lasts 120 days per year, with decent slopes such as Savin kuk, Štuoc and Javorovača.

Rafting - the 1300 m deep Tara River canyon is the second deepest in the world, and is listed as a UNESCO world heritage site. Rafting on Tara River is one of the most popular tourist activities in Montenegro.

Mountaineering - Durmitor's conditions are appropriate for this sport.

Hiking - The surrounding area of the town of Žabljak provides hiking paths.

Among the main tourist attractions of Durmitor are 18 glacier lakes; the biggest and closest to Žabljak being Crno jezero, literally "Black Lake". Durmitor's slopes are also becoming increasingly popular among snowboarders.




